2004 TURKEY SEASON SUMMARY

Spring Seasons

Vermont's 2004 spring turkey seasons (April 24-25 youth weekend and May 1-31 regular season) resulted in a total harvest of 3,925 bearded birds, up slightly (6.3 %) from the 2003 spring total of 3,694. This compares with an average spring harvest of 4,058 during 2001-2002.

The 2004 two-day youth season produced 371 birds, also up slightly (4%) from the previous year's youth season harvest of 356 birds and compares with an average of 422 birds taken by youths during 2001-2002.

Many hunters complained the male birds seemed unusually "quiet" this spring. Although breeding activity may have occurred earlier in 2004 than in recent years, hunter success remained virtually unchanged. In 2004, 22.9% of hunters harvested at least one turkey, compared with 21.9% of hunters taking at least one bird in 2003.

Spring hunting pressure in 2004, measured by estimated sales of spring turkey licenses (13,942), was nearly identical to 2003 license sales of 13,986

This flattening trend in turkey hunting license sales is a fairly significant change from the rapid rise in sales experienced from 1998 to 2002, when sales increased 214%.

Hunting weather always plays a significant role in the overall harvest. Rains during the May season (and especially throughout the third week) challenged hunters and may have dampened harvest numbers somewhat. The effect of the April youth hunt on subsequent May gobbling activity and harvest is unknown, but disturbance from early hunting activity may also influence bird behavior and hunting success during the regular spring season.

Adult birds comprised 43% of the harvest. The lower percentage of adults in the harvest may be the result of lower spring productivity in 2002, dampening numbers of birds in the two-year age class. Spring birds were harvested in a record 231of Vermont's 253 towns by 3,200 successful hunters. Among these successful hunters, 22.7% harvested an additional bearded bird to fill the two-bird spring bag limit.

For the first time, the entire state of Vermont was open to hunting for all licensed turkey hunters in 2004. This included the northern portion of Wildlife Management Unit (WMU) E and all of WMU C, areas that had previously been closed to turkey hunting. As a result of this change, 95 birds were harvested in WMU E in 2004, compared to the previous year's total of 28 birds taken from a limited area in the most southerly portion of zone E. In zone C, 69 birds were harvested. Counties with the highest harvest were Rutland (540) followed by Orange (539) and Addison (503) while notably, the harvest from Bennington County continued to decline, accounting for 194 birds.

The vagaries of weather and its impact on spring productivity, turkey populations and harvests are unpredictable and difficult to gauge. Harvest levels from recent years suggest that Vermont's turkey population may be stabilizing at a level somewhat below the peak numbers experienced in 2001. Cool, rainy weather during the spring of 2003 reduced chick production and survival, and this scenario may have been repeated in 2004. If so, fewer birds will be available for harvest in the spring of 2005. In light of this and in the interest of maintaining Vermont's high quality spring turkey hunting season, a continued, conservative fall harvest structure is warranted.

2004 Fall Season

The 2004 fall season resulted in a harvest of 1,168 either-sex birds, up 11% from the fall 2003 harvest of 1,049 birds and somewhat higher than the previous three fall seasons' average of 962 birds. Once again in 2004, a relatively poor, hard mast crop likely inflated the overall harvest as is typical for Vermont in poor mast years. In general, fall harvests are poor indicators of Vermont's turkey population trend.

The 2004 fall archery-only season accounted for 137 of the harvested birds, with the balance of the birds (1,031) taken in the shotgun season. Fall birds were taken in 151 Vermont towns.

As many of our reporting agents and hunters have a difficult time discerning the sex and age of fall harvested birds, particularly immature birds. We have learned to view the accuracy of our fall sex and age reported data with caution and some skepticism. Final tallies indicate immature birds comprised 50% of the harvest, while females accounted for about 45% of the total harvest. Of the females, 75% were adult birds and 25% were immature. The immature to adult female ratio was 1: 0.7, suggesting fair spring nesting success. Wildlife Management Unit J1 reported the highest number of fall birds with 184, followed by WMU K2 with 134 birds and F1 reporting 132.
